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Specialized Care for Advanced Illness

HopeHealth Advanced Illness Care provides

- Skilled communication, especially when difficult decisions need to be made by care teams, patients or families.
- Patient and caregiver education on what to expect as an illness progresses, and how to handle situations at home.
- Goals-of-care conversations to ensure that treatments match the changing needs and priorities of the patient and family over the course of a disease.
- Collaboration with any other services that a patient may have in the home, such as skilled home care and private duty services.
- Social workers and nurses are also available to support patients and families.





Partnering with referring providers:

- Our care is delivered primarily by nurse practitioners who closely collaborate with the referring provider practice.
- Our service is consultative, with recommendations made to the patient's provider
- In this model, HopeHealth clinicians do not prescribe medications.





Patient Eligibility

Patients who are in the late stages of their illness with decline in health status or function are eligible for the program. Program eligibility is based on general and disease-specific criteria adapted from CAIC (Consensus Standards for Community-Based Palliative Care).
